 - o New Business COVID-19 Resolution
 - x A resolution for the FS regarding COVID-19 policies was presented for a vote
 - o Call for a vote for the resolution (as is) for the FS regarding the COVID-19 Policies
 - o The FS voted and the resolution did not pass as a whole document
 - o Discussions to vote on each bullet point separately was voted on to approve each bullet point and then review the entire document for a second vote.
 - x Discussion of each individual bullet was completed with revisions made to each bullet point, and a separate vote for each bullet point was conducted:
 - o Call for a vote for bullet #1 "a vaccination mandate for eligible USA students, faculty, and staff."
 - o Call for a vote for bullet #2 "mandatory weekly COVID-19 testing for faculty, students and staff."
 - o Call for a vote for bullet #3 "adherence to CDC recommendations regarding social distancing and universal masking in classrooms and indoor public spaces."
 - o Call for a vote for bullet #4 " provide reasonable accommodation in the form of instructor choice in determining course and/or class delivery modes based on individual instructor and student circumstances."

- o Call for a vote for bullet #5 " significant and diverse faculty representation on any committees, groups, or task forces related to COVID-19 plans and policies (particularly on the University Committee for Reopening Campus where faculty are currently not represented)."
- o Call for a vote for bullet #6 "more frequent and transparent email updates on how (and why) specific COVID related policy decisions that impact the entire university community are being made."
- o Call for a vote for bullet #7 " a university-monitored system for notifying instructors of COVID-19 infected or exposed students in their classroom to ensure infectious individuals quarantine appropriately."
- o Each bullet point was passed by a majority vote of the FS
- o The Resolution was passed by a majority vote of the FS
